JOSE PIMIENTA

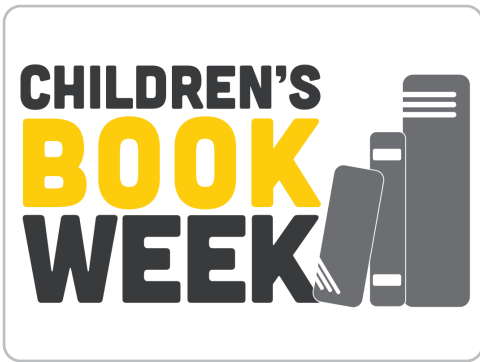
